

If you have an overdue balance on your utility account(s) and received a Pending Disconnection notice for your provider, you should **contact them immediately**.

How can I prevent my utilities from being disconnected?

If you have an unpaid balance, it is important to contact your provide as soon as possible. To avoid a full disconnection of service and additional charges you can:

- make a payment
- request a payment arrangement
- report any payments you have made

If you need assistance, contact a mediation officer.

How do I get my utilities reconnected?

If your utilities are disconnected, there are steps you can take to have them reconnected.

For electricity and natural gas customers, your service will not be fully restored until:

- You pay your account in full, or
- Your provider accepts a payment plan and agrees to restore service based on this arrangement. If you break your payment plan, your utilities may be disconnected.

How long does it take to reconnect my utilities?

Reconnection typically takes 48-72 hours, not including weekends or holidays.

Are There Reconnection Fees?

After reconnection, your first bill may include a reconnection fee and possibly a security deposit. If a distributor can reconnect you on the same day, you may be charged a higher reconnection fee. Be sure to discuss any additional charges with you provider before requesting same-day reconnection.
